### [Covidence for systematic reviews and literature searches](#)

Picture this: You're working on a systematic review or literature search and you've come up with 1,000+ citations. Great! But now what? It takes time to read and select relevant articles, coordinate decision making with your collaborators, and organize your results. When you're doing a review, this article-screening process can quickly become a daunting task. But you're in luck! Through November 2018, Cornell University Library is piloting an unlimited license to [Covidence](#), giving Cornell faculty, students and

staff free access to a web-based software platform that streamlines the production of systematic reviews.

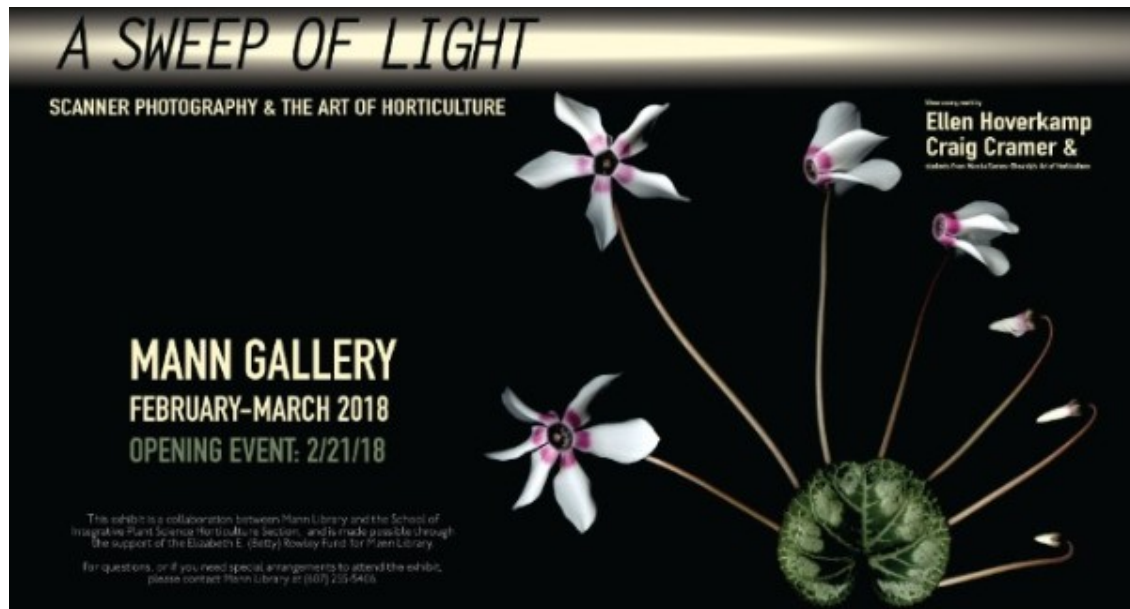
